From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Centenary UMC,

There have been two groups in the church which have taken six weeks to study, <u>Christianity and World Religions</u> by Adam Hamilton. We explored Hinduism, Buddhism, Judaism, Muslim, and Christianity. It was a fascinating study. Adam Hamilton encouraged us to learn the differences and similarities of the differing religions, but to focus on the similarities. The last religion which we studied was our own, Christianity. Adam Hamilton took the Bible Verse, John 3: 16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.", and broke it down to explain the key components of the Faith. The Great Reformer, Martin Luther, once called this verse, "the gospel in miniature" (Christianity and World Religions, Hamilton, pg. 128).

Hamilton suggests that this tells us that we are loved, our purpose in life, that we can be forgiven, and that we always have hope.

God created us to love God and others as God loves them. We simply must receive the gift of God's love and share God's love with others. In the class, we discussed how simple this is, and yet we make it very difficult. Our human condition places conditions, where God is unconditional love, grace, faith, mercy, and hope.

I see the church living out God's love and mercy in many ways. I feel that the best compliment we recently received as a church was from one of our guests at the Community Breakfast who stated, "I truly feel that I am received here without judgement but only love."

As we go into the month of November focusing on Gratitude, let us give thanks for our attitude of being loved as children of God and offering that to all.

God is very good all the time – a priceless gift.

May we never forget.

Please know that my door is always open.



Centenary Starlight Book Club

The Starlight Book Club will meet Thursday, November 14 (note date change from usual 3rd Thursday) at 6:30 PM at Lucky 32 to discuss Lost Roses: A Novel by Martha Hall Kelly.

The runaway bestseller *Lilac Girls* introduced the real-life heroine Caroline Ferriday. This sweeping new novel, set a generation earlier and also inspired by true events, features Caroline's mother, Eliza, and follows three equally indomitable women from St. Petersburg to Paris under the shadow of World War I.

It is 1914 and the world has been on the brink of war so many times, many New Yorkers treat the subject with only passing interest. Eliza Ferriday is thrilled to be traveling to St. Petersburg with Sofya Streshnayva, a cousin of the Romanov's. The two met years ago one summer in Paris and became close confidantes. Now Eliza embarks on the trip of a lifetime, home with Sofya to see the splendors of Russia. But when Austria declares war on Serbia and Russia's Imperial dynasty begins to fall, Eliza escapes back to America, while Sofya and her family flee to their country estate. In need of domestic help, they hire the local fortuneteller's daughter, Varinka, unknowingly bringing intense danger into their household. On the other side of the Atlantic, Eliza is doing her part to help the White Russian families find safety as they escape the revolution. But when Sofya's letters suddenly stop coming she fears the worst for her best friend.

From the turbulent streets of St. Petersburg to the avenues of Paris and the society of fallen Russian emigre's who live there, the lives of Eliza, Sofya, and Varinka will intersect in profound ways, taking readers on a breathtaking ride through a momentous time in history.

The next book which we will discuss will be on January 16, 2020 – The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek by Kim Michele Richardson.

The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek is a powerful message about how the written word affects people--a story of hope and heartbreak, raw courage and strength splintered with poverty and oppression, and one woman's chances beyond the darkly hollows. Inspired by the true and historical blue-skinned people of Kentucky and the brave and dedicated Kentucky Pack Horse library service, The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek showcases a bold and unique tale of the Pack horse Librarians in literary novels.
